# Effective Bullying Prevention and Intervention Practices for NJ Anti-Bullying Specialists

A new course for Spring, 2012

## COURSE DESCRIPTION

This semester-long, 15-week course is designed to assist New Jersey school Anti-Bullying Specialists (ABS's) with effective strategies to prevent and intervene with student harassment, intimidation, and bullying (HIB) and to comply with legally mandated responsibilities for the ABS role. Course content will be consistent with New Jersey legal requirements, research, and best practices. By completing this course, professionals will be able to review, update, and implement local policies, procedures, and programs to address HIB. Transcript and certificate issued upon completion.

## ABOUT THE INSTRUCTORS
